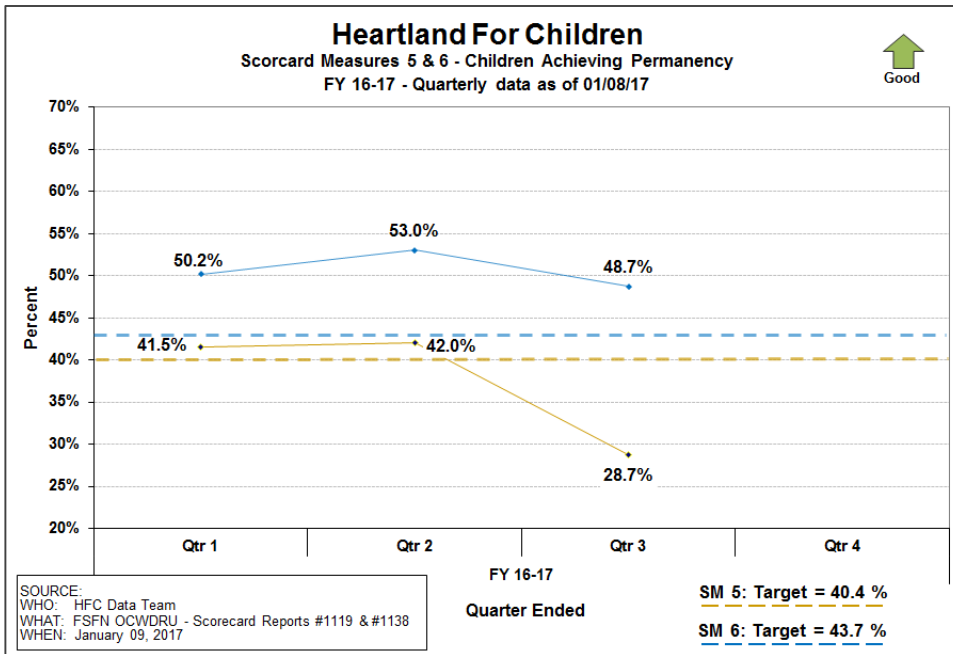

Children Entering Care between 01/01/15 – 03/31/15 and Achieved Timely Permanency: **99**



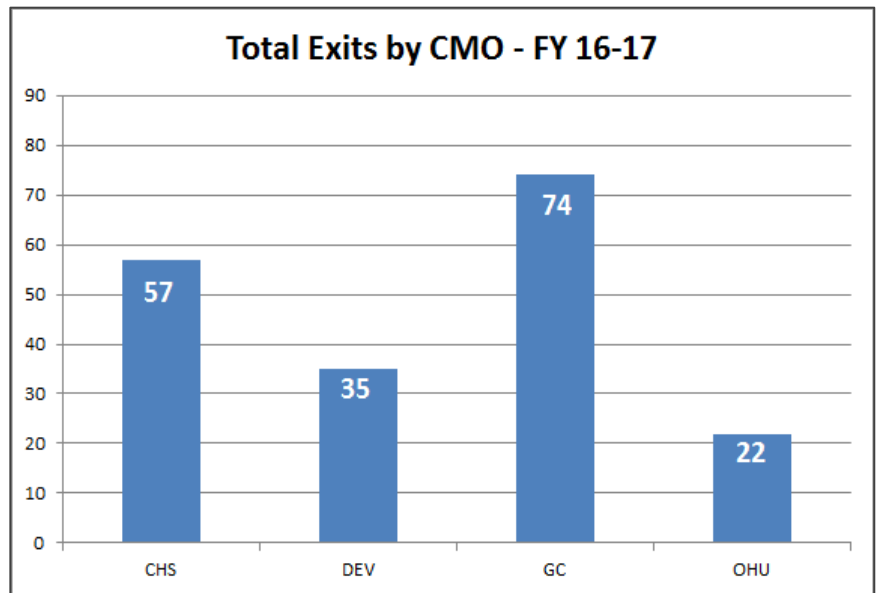
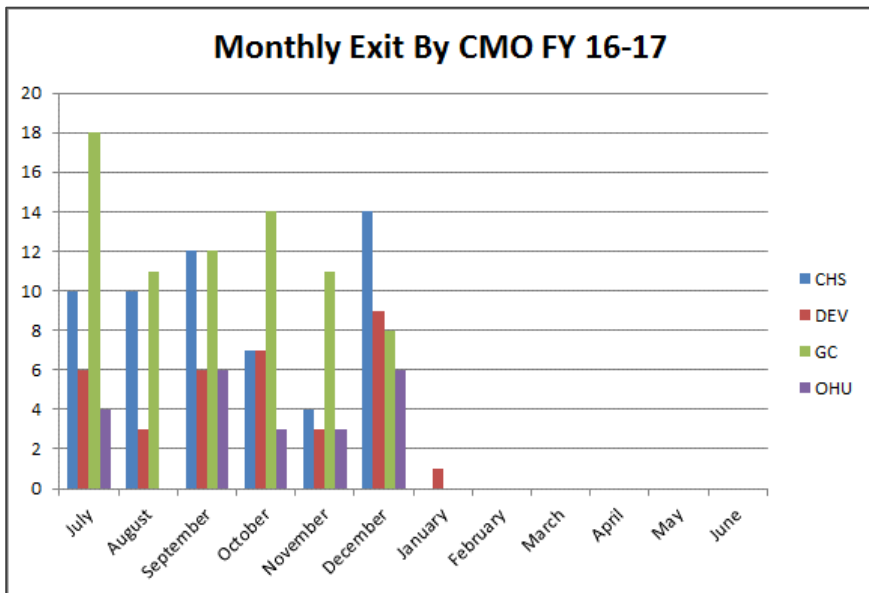
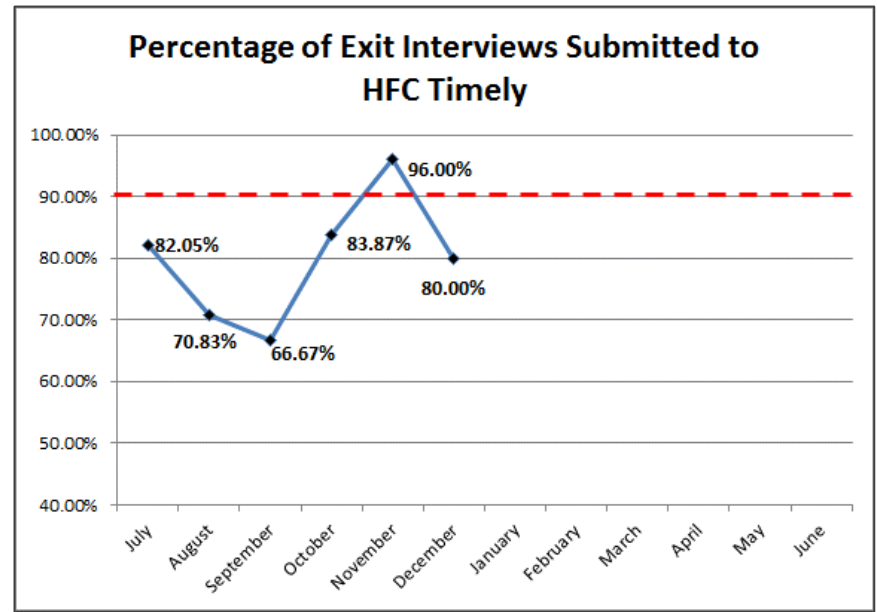
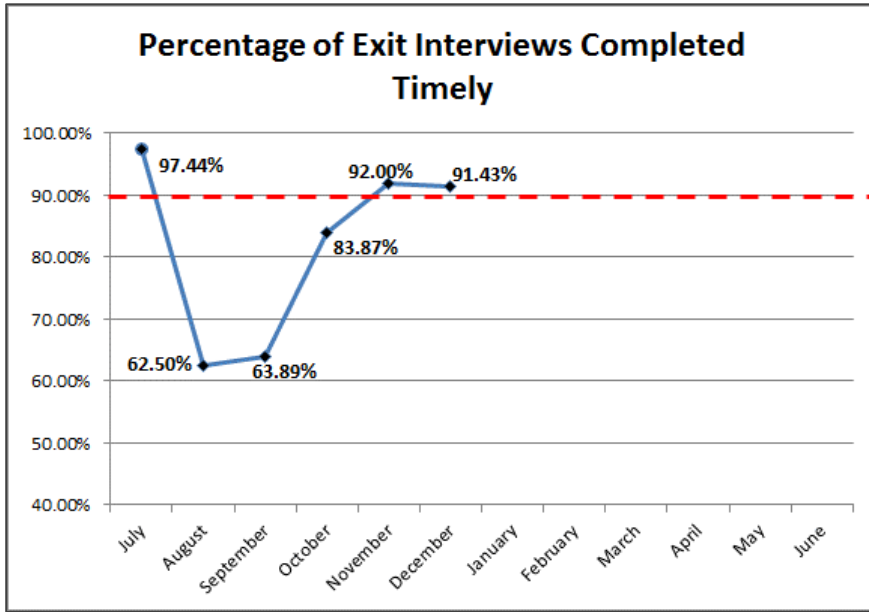
Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 82.63%



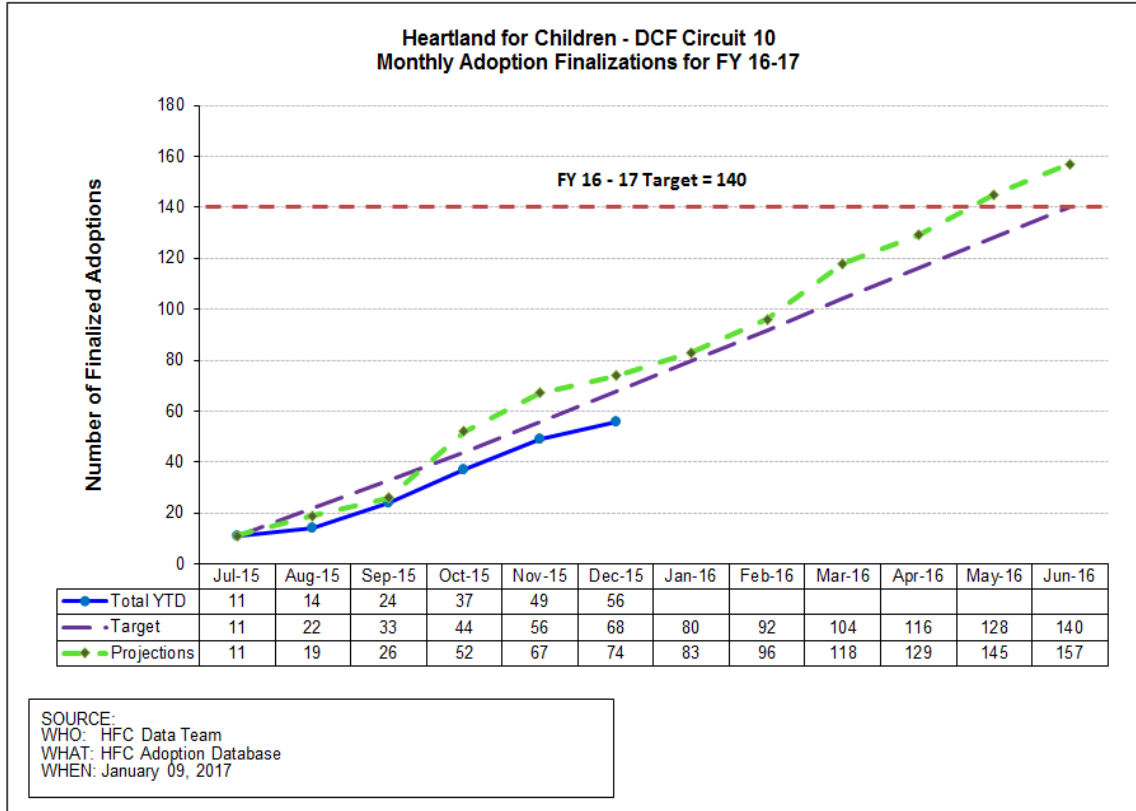
Exit Interviews Trending by CMO

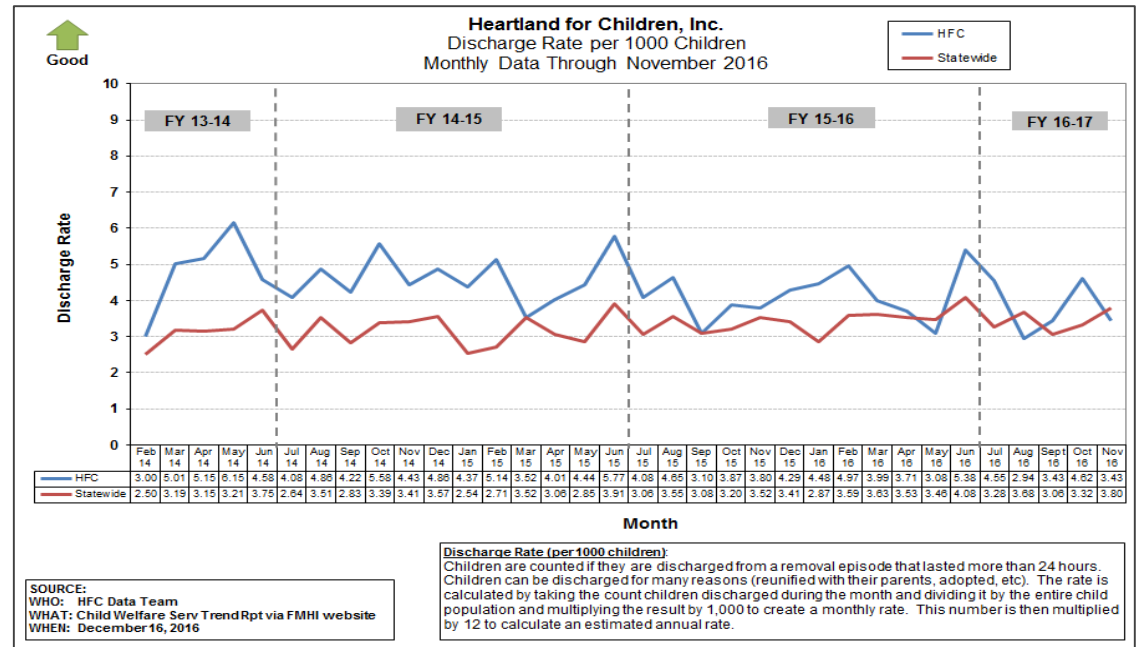
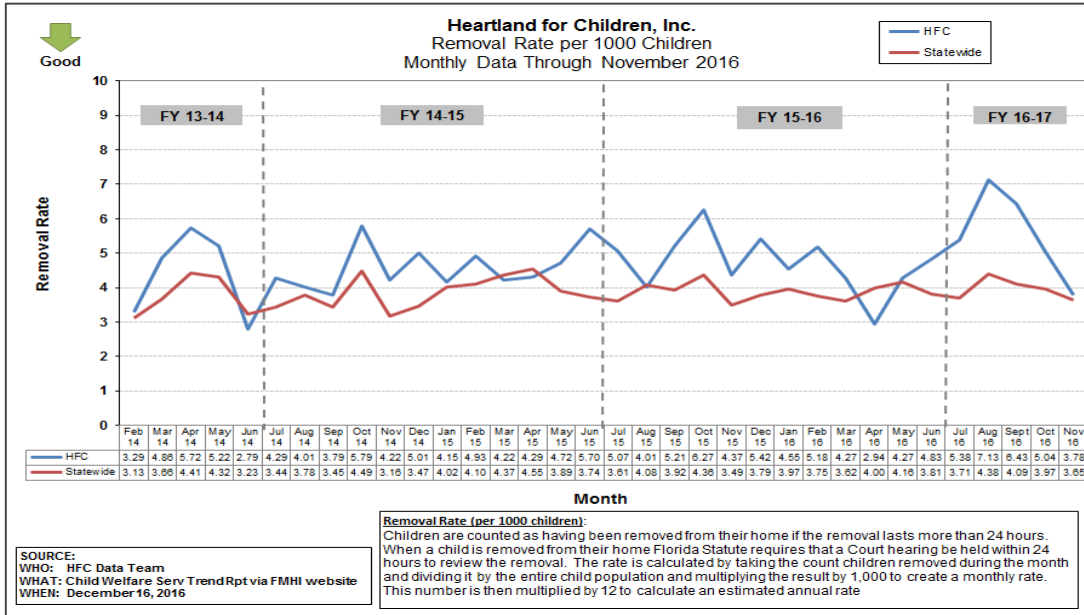


Average Cost and Length of Stay for Children by Case Management Organization

Monthly Removal and Discharge Rates (per 1,000 Children) as of November 2016

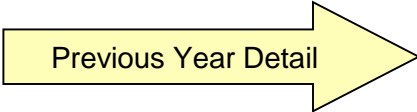

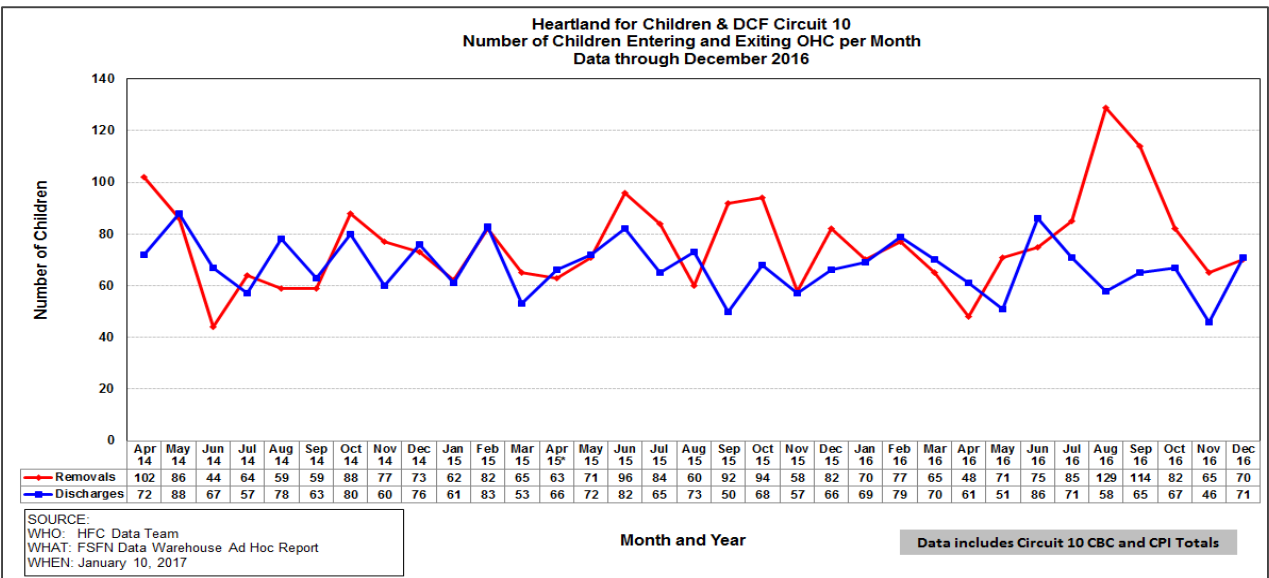

Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month





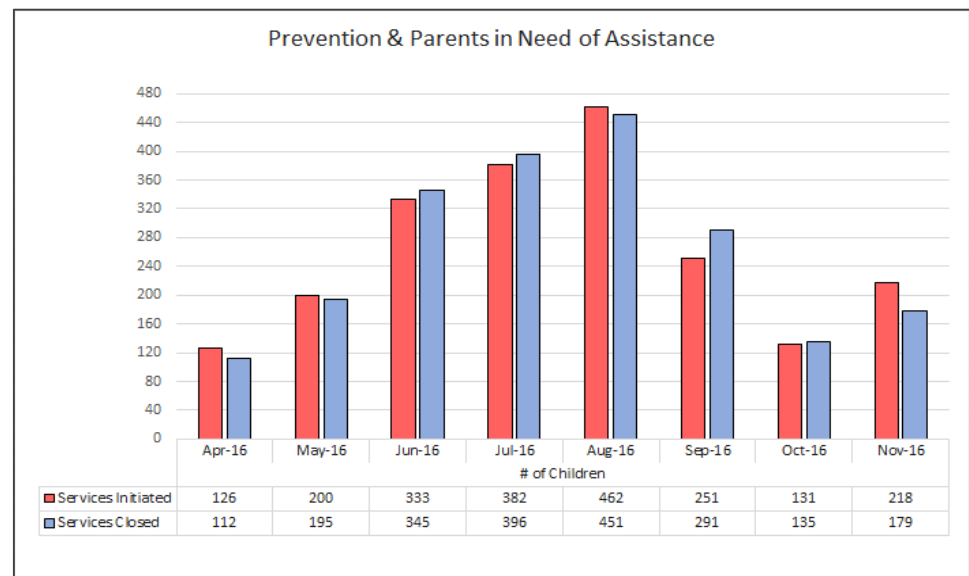
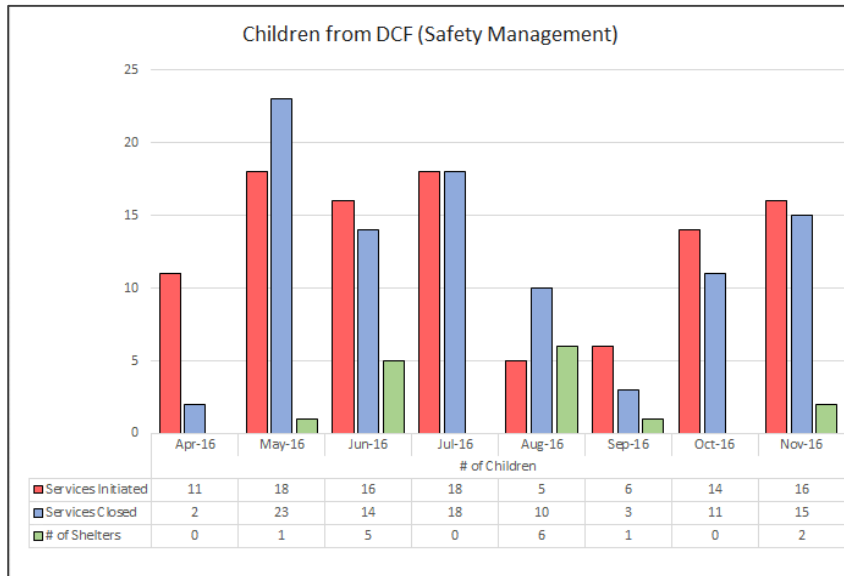
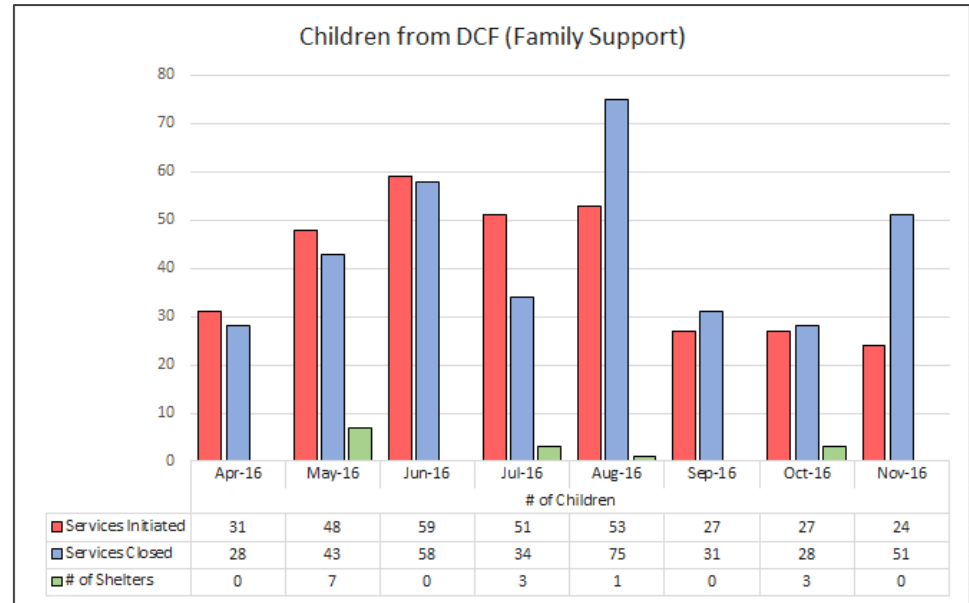

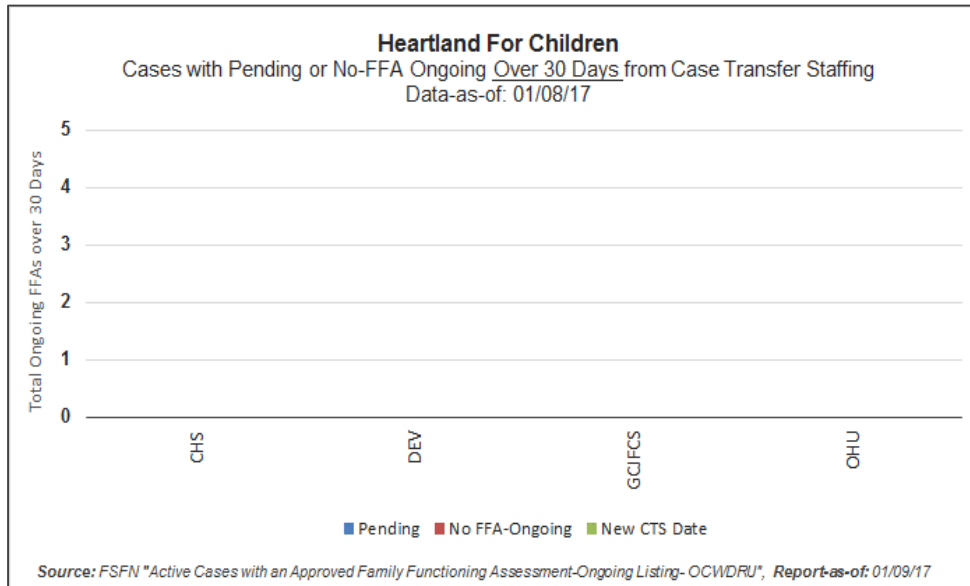

KNOWLEDGE TO **ACTION**

Knowledge: Concurrent Case Planning

- Concurrent planning is an approach that seeks to eliminate delays in attaining permanent families for children in the foster care system
- Concurrent planning involves considering all reasonable options for permanency at the earliest possible point following a child's entry into foster care and concurrently pursuing those options that will best serve the child's needs.
- It involves a mix of family centered casework and legal strategies aimed at achieving timely reunification, while at the same time establishing a concurrent permanency plan if reunification cannot be accomplished.
- When pursued respectfully and professionally, concurrent planning can enhance child safety, prevent excessive moves while in care, strengthen family relationships, and create a sense of urgency for the parents

Action: Take the right steps

1. Differential assessment and prognostic case review.
2. Full disclosure to all participants in the case planning process.
3. Family search and engagement
4. Family group conferencing
5. Parent-child visiting during out-of-home care
6. Setting clear time limits for permanency decisions.
7. Transparent written agreements and documentation
8. Committed collaboration between child welfare, the courts, and service providers
9. Focused support for resource families
10. Most importantly, the concurrent plan must be actively pursued during the entire life of the case.

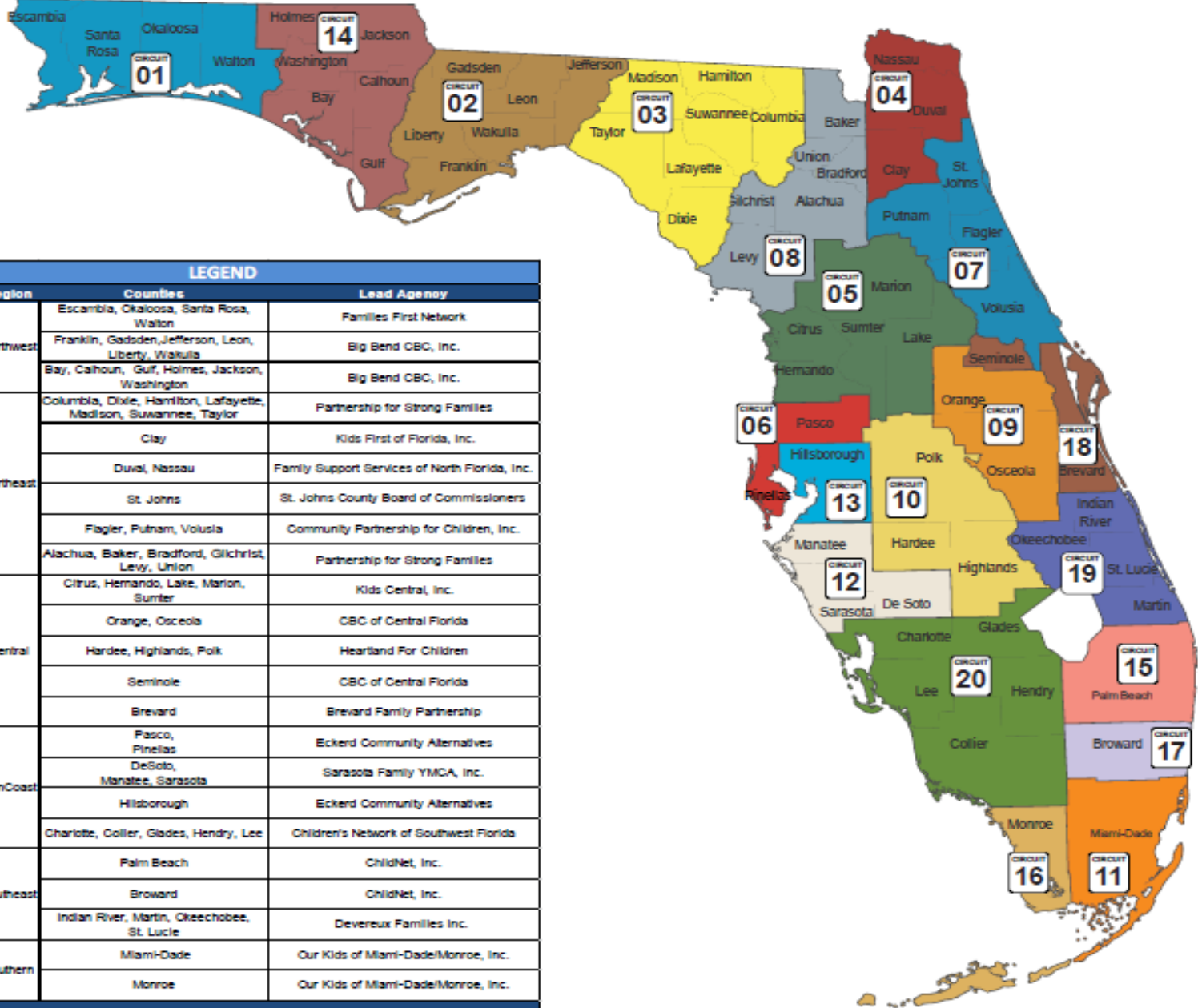
