




Number of sibling groups to achieve SM12 target – 29 Sibling Groups



Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month








Neighbor to Family – Weekly & Monthly Census 22-23 Fiscal Year to Month - Percentage of Children Not Sheltered: **95.6%**






