

Scorecard Measure 7 – Children Who Do Not Re-Enter Care






Scorecard Measure 12 – Separated Siblings

SM12 - Percent of Sibling Groups Placed Together








Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 58.89%









Exit Interviews Trending by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 58.89/%








Adoption Finalizations



Number of Children Sheltered - Occurring by 2-Week Period Trending







Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month








Neighbor to Family – Weekly & Monthly Census










