

#### Scorecard Measure 7 – Children Who Do Not Re-Enter Care


Percentage of children who do not re-enter foster care within 12 months of moving to a permanent home.



Percentage of siblings groups in out-of-home care where all siblings are placed together.









## **Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO**

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 66.19%












## **Exit Interviews Trending by CMO**

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 66.19%









Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month









HFC – DCF Circuit 10 Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date











