

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

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
Children Entering Out of Home Care








Number of Foster Homes and Foster Bed Capacity











Children Served at Month End by Service Type

Number and Percent of Children Serviced in Residential Care












SM12 - Percentage of sibling groups in out-of-home care where all siblings are placed together – Target = 65.0%



Number of sibling groups to achieve SM12 target – 28 Sibling Groups







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
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Community Based Care Lead Agency Map
