Number of Children to Achieve SM05 Target - 20 Children



Scorecard Measure 7 – Children Who Do Not Re-Enter Care





Percentage of siblings groups in out-of-home care where all siblings are placed together.









Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 67.34%












Exit Interviews Trending by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 67.34%










Adoption Finalizations







HFC – DCF Circuit 10 Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date











Caseload Variance by Month

Number of Children Opening -vs- Closing to Services during Month (as of 04/30/20)











Number of Dental Visits to Achieve SM10 Target – **150 Appointments**





Number of children and young adults (ages 13-23) who require an IL Module in FSFN




