

#### Scorecard Measure 7 – Children Who Do Not Re-Enter Care



Number of Children in a Removal Episode Who Have Had a Prior Removal





#### Scorecard Measure 12 – Separated Siblings








#### **Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO**

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 78.43%









#### **Exit Interviews Trending by CMO**














#### Permanency for Children in Out of Home Care










Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month









HFC – DCF Circuit 10 Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date





# Promoting Father Involvement in Child Welfare

## Fatherhood is Fragile

- We must recognize the many possible reasons a father may not be involved
- Never view a father's noninvolvement as a lack of interest in the child
- Father involvement is closely connected to his relationship with the child's mother
  - The relationship between the father and mother is the single greatest determinant of successful father involvement
  - Services need to be provided to both the mother and father promoting the advantages of the father's involvement
- Grandparents and extended family influence father involvement
  - The mother's parents' acceptance or rejection of the father is critical to sustaining, rebuilding, or eliminating a father's role
  - The father's parents and family are a resource to help him develop a "father identity"
