




Number of sibling groups to achieve SM12 target - 16 Sibling Groups



Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month








Neighbor to Family – Weekly & Monthly Census 21-22 Fiscal Year to Month - Percentage of Children Not Sheltered: **97.5%**












Caseload Variance by Month




