
Number of Children to Achieve SM05 Target - 23 Children

Scorecard Measure 7 – Children Who Do Not Re-Enter Care





Percentage of siblings groups in out-of-home care where all siblings are placed together.









Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 46.03%












Exit Interviews Trending by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 46.03%










Adoption Finalizations





HFC – DCF Circuit 10 Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date









Number of Dental Visits to Achieve SM10 Target – **78 Appointments**






