

Scorecard Measure 7 – Children Who Do Not Re-Enter Care


Percentage of children who do not re-enter foster care within 12 months of moving to a permanent home.

Number of Children in a Removal Episode Who Have Had a Prior Removal





Scorecard Measure 12 – Separated Siblings









Exit Interview Timeliness by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 79.52%












Exit Interviews Trending by CMO

HFC Cumulative YTD Timeliness: 79.52%







Number of Children Entering and Exiting Out-of-Home Care per Month











HFC – DCF Circuit 10 Number of Missing Youth as of Reporting Date





Community Based Care: Hardee, Highlands & Polk Counties






Community Based Care Lead Agency Map
