McKinney-Vento

Homeless Definition

The term "homeless children and youths"-

(A) means individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence; and

(B) includes-

- children and youths who are sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason (doubled up);
- are living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations;
- are living in emergency or transitional shelters:
- are abandoned in hospitals;
- children and youths who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designated for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings;
- children and youths who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and
- migratory children who qualify as homeless for the purpose of this subtitle because the children are living in circumstances described above.
- "unaccompanied youth" (students not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian) who qualify as homeless for the purpose of this subtitle.

Educational Rights of Homeless Students

- Free, appropriate public education, no matter where the student lives;
- Immediate school enrollment when missing certain documentation (physical, immunization, birth certificate, school records, guardianship, and proofs of residency) and attendance in school while obtaining those necessary documents;
- Remain at the school of origin (school last enrolled in or attended), when in the best interest of the student;
- · Transportation to and from school of origin;
- Same special programs and services, if needed, as provided to all other children served in these programs;
- · Free breakfast and lunch.

Homeless Liaison and School District must ensure:

- Homeless students are identified by school personnel and through coordination activities with other entities and agencies.
- Students experiencing homelessness enroll in school and receive educational services for which they are eligible.
- Assist homeless children and youth who do not have proper documentation for school enrollment.
- Help unaccompanied youth choose and enroll in a school, after considering the youths' wishes.
- Inform parents or guardians of homeless students of the educational rights, including transportation to the school of origin, along with other educational and related opportunities available to their children.
- Public notice of the educational rights of students in homeless situations is disseminated where children and youth receive services.
- Enrollment disputes are mediated in accordance with the Enrollment Disputes section of the McKinney-Vento Act.
